**Deployment Highlights**

- Site set-up in a residential area in Kelowna, BC (parking lot of Interior Health Authority Administrative Offices)
- Collaborative deployment between BC Children’s Hospital Pediatric Hemophilia and St Paul’s Hospital Adult Hemophilia Teams to provide outreach to patients living with hemophilia in the Interior Health region
- Facilitated important patient check-ups for individuals who would otherwise have to travel to Vancouver or go without a check-up
- Provided [2.5 Hour Clinical Familiarization](#) Education program to clinicians from across the Interior Health region (travelling to Kelowna from as far away as 100 Mile House to participate in this unique education within the MMU)
- Endured extreme winter storm while travelling from Vancouver to Kelowna, demonstrating MMU ability to mobilize in inclement weather
