**Deployment Highlights**

- Served as temporary Intensive Care Unit (ICU) at East Kootenay Regional Hospital (EKRH) in Cranbrook while their facility underwent a 10-day renovation;
- Original plan to move patients from the four (4) bed ICU to the Emergency Department, but it was determined the MMU would ease stress on the Emergency Department and, therefore, preserve highest level of care for both ICU and Emergency patients;
- First time since the 2010 Winter Olympics that the MMU was used to provide critical care and was operational 24/7;
- Demonstrated flexibility of the MMU and its ability to serve as a true extension of a hospital (shown by successful connectivity between the MMU and hospital computer and phone systems, and other important medical systems); and
